Whereas the author has written an article—construed to include scholarly papers, book review articles, and any other material of scholarship published in the journal and/or its *Library Series*—which the author is owner of the contents thereof, it is agreed as follows:

- 1) The author assigns to Purdue University and *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* the right to publish and distribute the author's article. Consent to publish in *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* entails the author's irrevocable and exclusive authorization of *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* to collect any sums or considerations for copying or reproduction payable by third parties and/or to act in or out of court in connection therewith.
- 2) The author agrees to hold *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* harmless for any unauthorized use of the article subsequent to its publication in *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* in any media.
- 3) If the submitted and subsequently published article is culled from or is a version of a previous or forthcoming publication in full or in parts in a book, an online publication, an edited volume, a dissertation, etc., this must be indicated in a Note after the text of the article and above the Works Cited with a full bibliography of the other publication and the journal must receive the copyright release without which the article cannot be published.
- 4) Images can be published in the journal only if the journal receives copyright release documentation: Purdue University Press does not purchase copyright release.
- 5) In the case of the use of scholarship published in *CLCWeb: Comparative Literature and Culture* in teaching, online use is welcome without permission by Purdue University Press.
- 6) In websites such as academia.edu, researchgate.net, etc. authors are invited to place the bibliography of published articles with the article's DOI: Digital Object Identification Number (i.e., URL) and not the pdf of the article itself because this diminishes the download counts of publications from the journal.
