1) Collection Development Policy Statement Workshop Presenter: Tony Ferguson (Columbia University) Ferguson will provide information on how to develop a cost-effective collection development policy statement, e.g., how not to load up the costs of producing such a statement to the point that you can never get sufficient value out of the enterprise to want to keep it up to date.
