- Public Input & Engagement

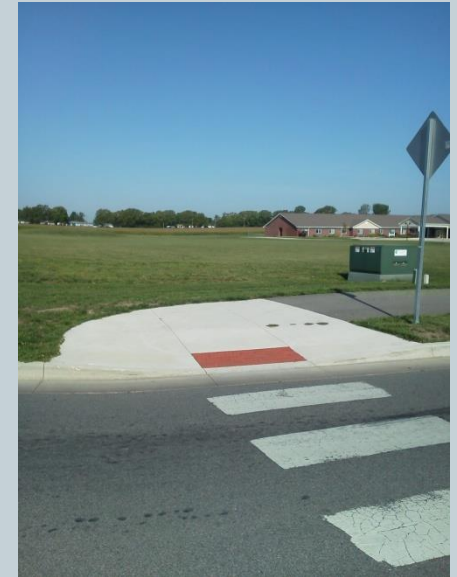
# Data Collection

**In Monticello, we hired an engineering firm to collect the data, photograph assets, and assist in determining compliance and compliance level. Each intersection was photographed and color coded to indicate compliance level.**

**Information about each intersection is available and at our finger tips to help plan for the future and address concerns.**

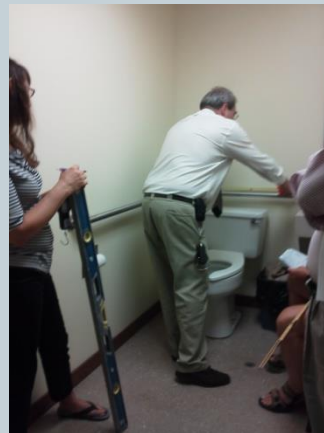


# Facilities, Programs, and Services

With an ADA Indiana COROS Grant we were able to host “*Facility Evaluation Training*”, by Eugene Hatke, Purdue University, Retired. This training was provided to our Mayor’s Advisory Council Volunteers, City & County Departments, and local business contractors. Our volunteers continue to use the knowledge learned as our evaluations are ongoing with city progress.



# Public Input & Engagement

**The Mayor's Advisory Council was established through City Council ordinance in April of 2013. This council is comprised of city department heads, community volunteers, and community members with disabilities. They meet monthly and their efforts not only satisfy the legal requirements for public input, but they engage our community with disabilities, and promote awareness through many activities.**
