## Provost Timothy D. Sands GPRI Policy Research for a Changing World "Grand Challenge" Conference Tuesday, April 9, 2013

- · Good morning.
- I'm happy to be here to kick off what I know will be an informative day for you...and I hope will be an inspirational one.
  - I know I'm inspired when I see the fascinating work of my peers I suspect many of you are the same way.
- As you know, Discovery Park was founded on the principle of interdisciplinary research.
  - The labs don't belong to a particular individual; they belong to the research. A team of the best thinkers is assembled depending on the problem they're trying to solve or the challenge they're trying to overcome.
    - This method has proven to be very successful and is becoming the standard for accelerating scientific discovery.
  - The interdisciplinary method is especially important when it comes to what we refer to as the "Grand Challenges" – the areas you're going to discuss today.
- Just as we know the Grand Challenges are not one dimensional in scope, we also know they do not have one, single solution.
  - Such themes as Health, Environment and Energy are complex and influenced by many factors – they require the thinking of many disciplines if we are to overcome the challenges they present.
- And Purdue is uniquely positioned to meet the need with internationally recognized professors, top-ranked graduate programs, and this distinctive framework for interdisciplinary discovery.
- Of the more than 1,500 policy institutes across the United States, including those at other Big Ten universities, very few include core participation from campus experts in science, engineering, and technology.

- GPRI emphasizes connections between science and society.
- The Institute is an active co-sponsor of seminars, forums and programs with dozens of colleges and centers at Purdue.
  - Today you will hear from experts within some of these partner centers.
- Cross-fertilization can be a powerful tool and all that is required of you is to listen and join in the discussion – that's what this day is for.
