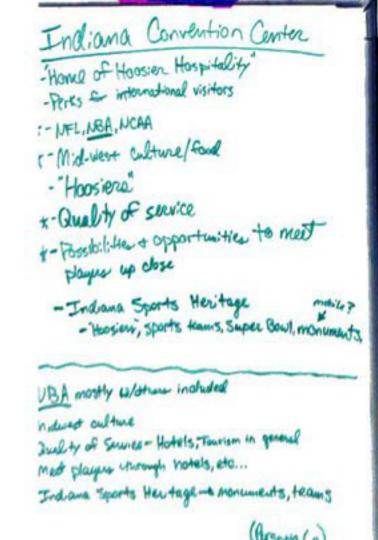
# LearnLab

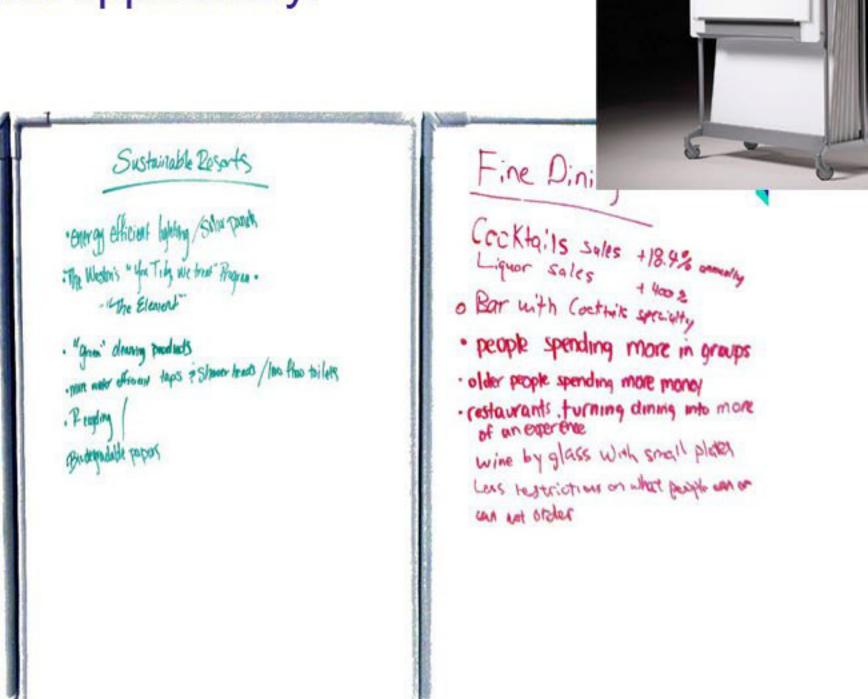

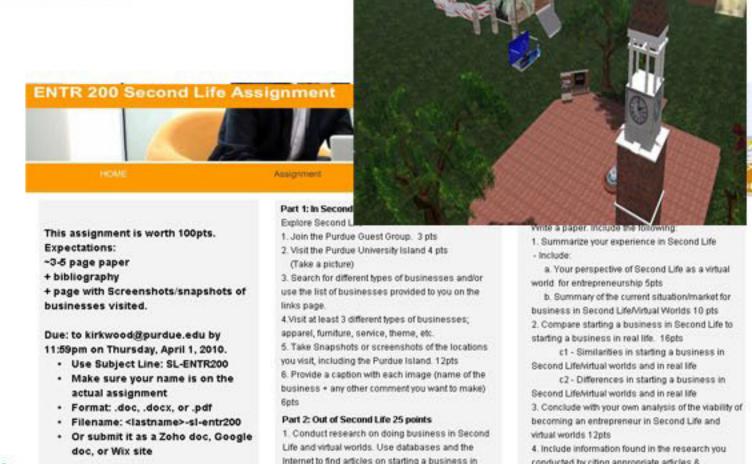
#### **GS 175 Objectives**
