The cities and towns listed in this report are only those who have filed a Form 225 i.e., population of 20,000 or greater (IC 8-17.4.1) or who are located in a county that has passed the LOHUT. If your city or town is not listed and you are using innovative financing for your roads and streets, please contact us.

We would like to draw your attention to the Appendix of this report. In the Appendix, you will find a flow chart detailing how the Motor Vehicle Highway Account (MVHA) and the Local Road and Street Account (LRSA) funds are distributed among the LPAs of Indiana.

Lastly, we would like you to know that some of the funding formulae are based on population. Although the population data presented are the 2010 census data, the 2000 Census data is still in effect. You can request a special census count before if your area undergoes unusual growth or if you believe that the 2010 census number should be different. You can obtain a special census count by calling the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of Census at 301.457.1722.

It is our hope that your LPA will find this report useful and informative. We plan to publish this report at least every two years. All of these tables are available in Microsoft Excel format. INTRODUCTION

This report provides information on revenues, distributions, and expenses of state and local governments for highway, road and street work. Since the Motor Vehicle Highway (MVH) and Local Road and Street (LRS) Accounts are the principal source of funds for local road or street construction and maintenance operations, this summary may be used to see the trends in income sources and in the expenses charged to the funds prior to their being distributed to the highway, road and street agencies.

This report contains 22 Tables divided into 3 Sections. Section 1 presents the different revenues available. Section 2 presents the distribution of the revenues. In Section 3, you will find tables on expenses. It is interesting to note that many agencies report administrative and operating expenses roughly equal to their MVH distribution. This leads to the conclusion that the only dedicated funds available for road and street improvements are the LRS monies.

Included in this report are all known funds used for highway and street construction and maintenance. These funds include, but not limited to: Local Option Highway Users Tax (LOHUT), County Adjusted Gross Income Tax (CAGIT), County Option Income Tax (COIT), County Economic Development Income Tax (CEDIT), County General Fund, Gaming Revenues, Bridge Funding and any Federal-Aid Funding granted for specific use in a local government.

For user information purposes, a table is included showing Highway and Street Department Statistics, i.e., population, miles of road, registered vehicles, etc. Some of these statistics are used in the funding allotment formulae.

At the end of this report, a flow chart shows the distribution of MVH and LRS funds. Contact us if you would like to study how your particular highway or street department allocation is calculated. It also will help you understand what factors weigh heaviest in deciding how many dollars you receive and the impact of changes to any of the factors in the formulae. You will then find two Attachments that help clarify Motor Vehicle Highway Account distribution formulae, Local Road and Street Account formulae, and the budget revenue estimates for 2011.

The years of the various funding source, from which the tables are prepared, are not all the same. Some are calendar year, some are state fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) and some are federal fiscal year (October 1 to September 30). To assist in understanding the funding cycles, annotations are presented detailing the source of funds, the authority for the funds and the year for which the funds are distributed.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 2009 Summary of Highway Revenues, Distributions and Expenses shows significant changes in the funding available for local governments and the evolving funding options many local governments are using to fund their transportation needs. Increase in the variety of revenue sources and further reliance on local funding is evident in the annual operational reports. Supplemental revenues being used by counties, cities and towns come from a number of sources. A few of the major sources include LOHUT, CAGIT, CEDIT, COIT, TIF, gaming funds, financial institution taxes, commercial vehicle excise taxes, and in some southern counties, funds from national forest distributions. While not a significant source of funds in governments with smaller populations, the presence of these funds clearly shows that local government officials understand the importance of their local transportation systems and are finding the means to help supplement funding shortfalls.

This report details the MVH and LRS fund revenues over time. It is significant to note that the MVH fund receipts for the 2008-2009 state fiscal year have decreased below the 2000-2001 state fiscal year amounts. The LRS fund receipts for 2008-2009 have decreased to levels below those in 2001-2002. It is encouraging to see that Federal Aid has increased in recent years with only the 2008-2009 amount being one percent less than the previous year.

It is also interesting to note that even with decreasing revenues in the traditional funds, there has been an increase over time in the amount of Local Option Highway User Tax revenues. As mentioned above, local agencies understand the need for supplemental revenue sources and are working with the different sources available to them to help offset some of the shortfalls from other sources. With forty seven of the ninety two counties participating, the amount of revenue generated by the LOHUT was nearly eighteen percent of the MVH and LRS distributions to the local agencies. County option income taxes were another large contributor to the supplemental revenue sources with an amount nearly eight percent of the MVH and LRS collected as detailed in the County operational reports. Agencies that have access to gaming funds also receive a significant source of additional funding as these sources brought in a total of approximately nine percent of the total MVH and LRS. General funds, cumulative capital funds and TIF districts brought in nearly eight percent of the total MVH and LRS as well.

Comparisons of operational reports from previous years indicate that local agencies expenses have also increased.

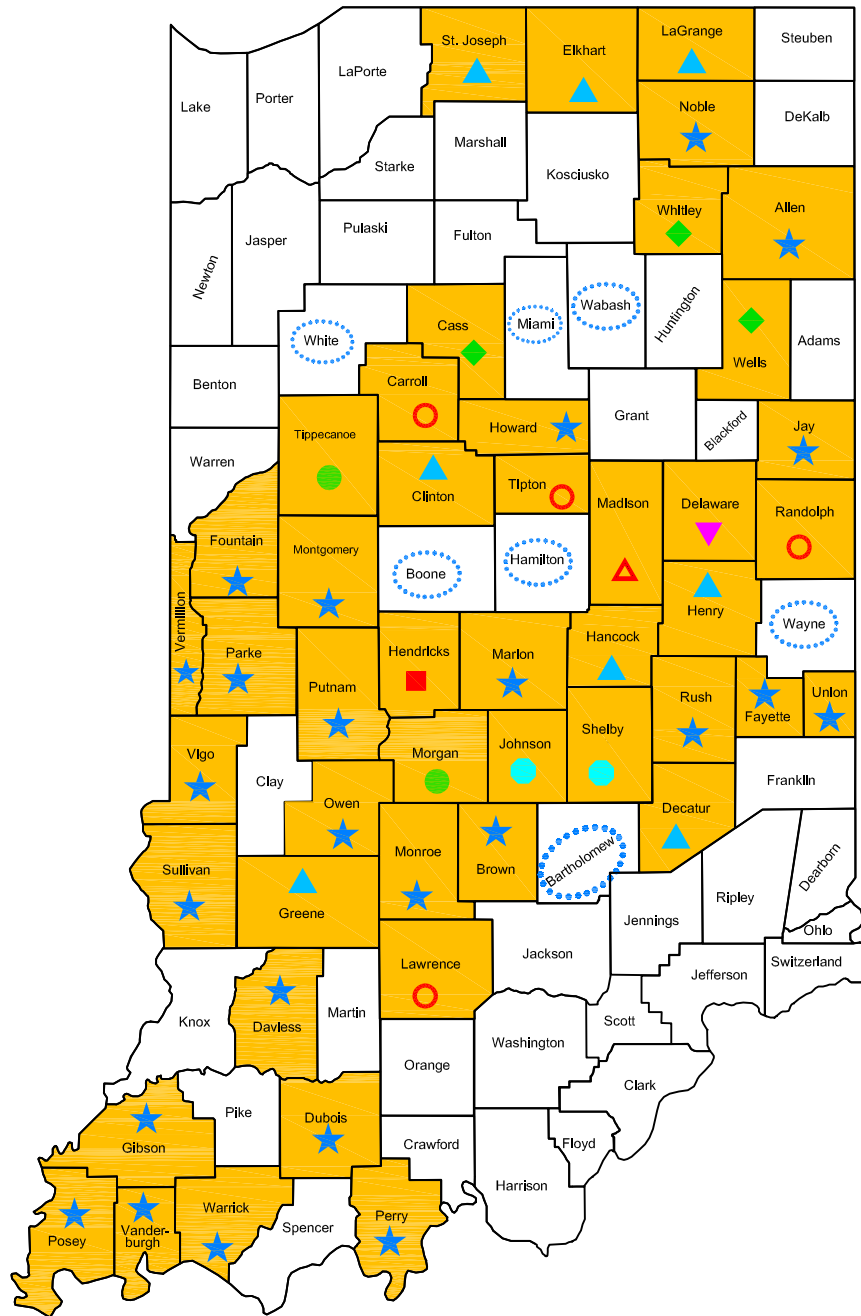

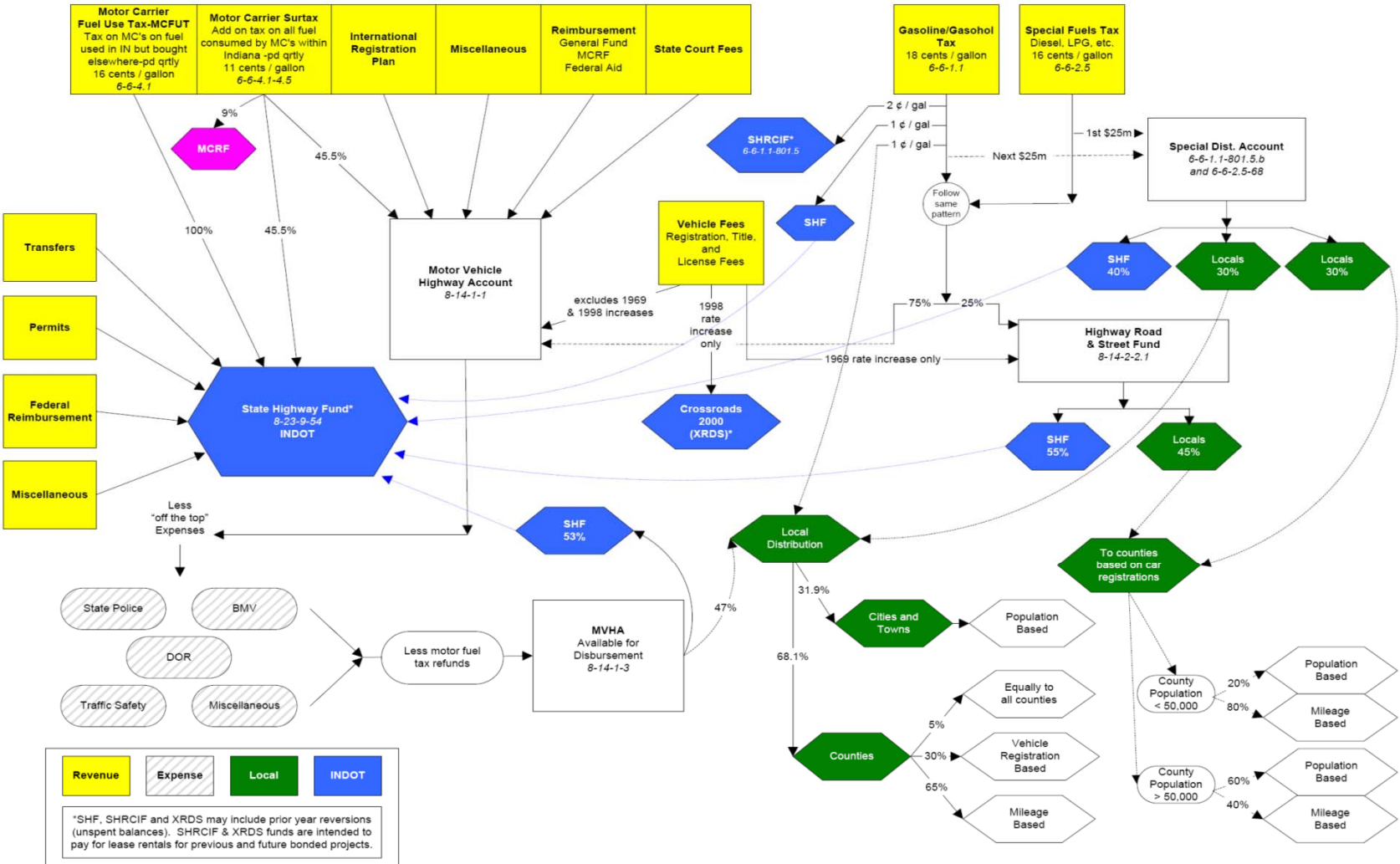

MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY DISTRIBUTION FORMULA

Motor Vehicle Highway distributions are made monthly to the Indiana Department of Transportation, counties, cities and towns in the following manner.

REVENUE SOURCES:

- ◆ 75% of 15 cents of the Gasoline Tax after the first \$25 million less fuel tax refunds
- ◆ 75% of Special Fuel Tax after the first \$25 million less fuel tax refunds
- ◆ 45.5% of Motor Carrier Surtax
- ◆ Motor Carrier Fund fiscal year end balance exceeding \$500,000
- ◆ Vehicle registration and title fees (excluding 1969 increase)
- ◆ Drivers license fees and defensive driver school fees
- ◆ 40% of the amount deposited to the motor vehicle odometer fund
- ◆ Abandoned vehicle fund fiscal year end balance exceeding \$20,000
- ◆ \$3.6 million of the state's share of court cost
- ◆ Federal grants for traffic safety and state police programs
- ◆ State general fund reimbursement of state police expense
- ◆ Motor carrier fund reimbursement of state police expense
- ◆ Toll road reimbursement of state police expense
- ◆ Gaming Commission reimbursement of state police expenses

EXPENSES:

- ◆ 61.307% of the State Police expenses
- ◆ Department of Revenue fuel tax collection expenses
- ◆ Bureau of Motor Vehicles expenses (does not include license branch expenses, but does include license plate production expense)
- ◆ Traffic safety programs
- ◆ School safety programs
- ◆ Forensic and Health Science Laboratory
- ◆ Motor Vehicle Highway Fund audit cost

AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR DISTRIBUTIONS:

Equals monthly revenues less monthly expenses.

MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY DISTRIBUTION FORMULA

ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR DISTRIBUTIONS:

Indiana statute and state budget adjustments are made to the amount available for distribution before distributions are made to the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), counties, cities and towns.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE AFTER ADJUSTMENTS:

Motor Vehicle Highway distributions are made monthly as follows:

53% of the amount available for distribution less adjustments is distributed to the **INDOT**

15% of the amount available for distribution less adjustments, plus 31.915% of one cent of the gasoline tax is distributed to **Cities and Towns**

The amount distributed to Cities and Towns is allocated on the basis of population (Fire Special Service district population used for City of Indianapolis distribution)

32% of the amount available for distribution less adjustments, plus 68.085% of one cent of the gasoline tax is distributed to **Counties**

The amount distributed to Counties is allocated as follows:

5% equally, 65% road mileage basis and **30% total vehicle registrations** basis

PERMISSIBLE USES:

Motor Vehicle Highway distributions can be used by counties, cities and towns for the expenses of highway and street departments, construction, maintenance and reconstruction cost of streets and roads, and equipment purchases. Cities and towns can use a portion of the distribution for public safety expenditures

LOCAL ROAD AND STREET DISTRIBUTION FORMULA

Local Road and Street distributions are made monthly to the Indiana Department of Transportation, counties, cities and towns from the following revenue sources and in the following manner:

REVENUE SOURCES: □□□ 25% of 15 cents of the Gasoline Tax after the first \$25 million
◆ 25% of Special Fuel Tax after the first \$25 million
◆ 1969 increase in vehicle registration and title fees.

DISTRIBUTION PERCENTAGES:

- ◆ 55% to the Indiana Department of Transportation
- ◆ 45% to Counties, Cities and Towns

DISTRIBUTION METHOD:

The Counties, Cities and Towns distribution calculation is a **two step process**.

Step one determines the county **total allocation** for each county on the basis of **passenger car registrations**.

Step two allocates each county total allocation between the county and the cities and towns within the county as follows:

A county with a **population of more than 50,000** the distribution is calculated as follows:

- ◆ **60%** of the county total allocation calculated in Step one is allocated on the basis of **population**.
(Fire Special Service district population used for City of Indianapolis distribution)
- ◆ **40%** of the county total allocation calculated in Step one is allocated on the basis of **road and street mileage**.

A county with a **population of 50,000 or less** the distribution is calculated as follows:

- ◆ **20%** of the county total allocation calculated in Step one is allocated on the basis of **population**.
- ◆ **80%** of the county total allocation calculated in Step one is allocated on the basis of **road and street mileage**.

PERMISSIBLE USES:

Local Road and Street distributions can be used by counties, cities and towns for construction, maintenance and reconstruction cost of streets and roads, engineering, land acquisitions, and equipment.

MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY ACCELERATED #1 AND #2 FORMULA

The Motor Vehicle Highway Accelerated #1 and #2 distribution formulas distribute:

- The first \$25 million of 15 cents of the gasoline tax and
- The first \$25 million of special fuel tax
- Collected after July 1 of each year.

Currently, it takes two months to collect the total \$50 million of fuel taxes. The Motor Vehicle Highway Accelerated #1 and #2 distributions are made in the months of August and September.

After the first \$50 million of fuel taxes have been collected and distributed with the Motor Vehicle Highway Accelerated #1 and #2 distribution formulas, then

- 75% of 15 cents of the gasoline tax and 75% of the special fuel tax is distributed monthly through the motor vehicle highway distribution formula and
- 25% of 15 cents of the gasoline tax and 25% of the special fuel tax is distributed monthly through the local road and street distribution formula.

REVENUE SOURCES:

- The first \$25 million of 15 cents of the gasoline tax and
- The first \$25 million of special fuel tax
- Collected after July 1 of each year

DISTRIBUTION PERCENTAGES:

- ◆ 40% to the Indiana Department of Transportation (\$20 million)
- ◆ 60% to Counties, Cities and Towns (\$30 million)

DISTRIBUTION METHOD:

MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY ACCELERATED #1 (MVH#1)

\$15 million is distributed to Counties, Cities and Towns using the Local Road and Street distribution formula.
(Fire Special Service district population used for City of Indianapolis distribution)

MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY ACCELERATED #2 (MVH#2)

\$15 million is distributed to Counties, Cities and Towns using the Motor Vehicle Highway distribution formula.
(Fire Special Service district population used for City of Indianapolis distribution)

PERMISSIBLE USES:

MVH #1 and MVH #2 permissible uses are the same as Motor Vehicle Highway distributions.
