Recommended lengths vary for critical essays, research studies, or essay reviews (7500 words); book reviews (1000–2000 words); and commentaries or rejoinders to published pieces (800 words). Alternative or imaginative submissions, such as poetry, creative nonfiction, and narrative, will be considered; please consult the editor prior to submission.

Manuscripts should conform to APA or Chicago style. There should be no author identifiers in the manuscript file, as the review process is anonymous.
