Have you read a new PBL book that you would like others to know about and read? With this issue we introduce a new Book Review section to *IJPBL*, and we invite individuals to write and submit book reviews for publication.

A good book review does more than summarize: It places the book in a larger context of scholarship; it makes explicit application to the instructional or research context of our readers; and it describes the value and usefulness that the book might have for scholars and teachers. Reviews are intended to identify current research and practice of PBL within a range of contexts (P-12 to adult; school to informal settings; management; policy to research).

Please submit your book review through *IJPBL* online at <http://docs.lib.purdue.edu/ijpbl/>. When you submit your review to the system, please use "Book Review" as the start of your title in order to separate it from other submissions. Although book reviews do not go through a double-blind peer-reviewed process, they will be reviewed by the editorial team, who may accept your review, require changes, or reject it outright.

### Format for book review

1. Book review length should be approximately 750 words, or three pages, double spaced.
2. The title of the book review should be left justified following APA format.

If you would like to do a review but are unsure which title to write about, please note that we maintain a list of books we would like to see reviewed.
