Checklist of Recent Writing Scholarship: April 1986-March 1987

The following checklist attempts to cover recent published scholarship of interest to those who administer, work in, or make use of writing centers. Each of the nearly one hundred items relates directly to writing center theory and/or practice (other scholarship on writing, though often pertinent to writing center concerns, is not included). The National Writing Centers Association will draw upon this Checklist for its annual awards for Outstanding Writing Center Scholarship. Awards will be given at the Special Interest Session for Writing Center Directors at the 1988 College Composition and Communication Conference in St. Louis. This year's awards, given at 4C's in Atlanta, went to Irene Clark for her book, *Writing in the Center: Teaching in a Writing Center Setting* (Kendall/Hunt, 1985), and Edward Lotto for his article, "The Writer's Subject is Sometimes a Fiction" (*Writing Center Journal* Fall/Winter 1985). In addition, Joyce Kinkead, Executive Secretary of NWCA, received an award for her distinguished service.
