## Conferences

The second annual conference of NCTE's **Assembly for Expanded Perspectives on Learning**, "Teaching the Unconscious: Re-forming Classrooms, Theories, and the Self," will be held at Estes Park Center, CO June 6-9, 1996. Featured presenters will be Jean Borysenko, author of *Minding the Body, Mending the Mind* and President of Mind/Body Health Sciences; Carol Pearson, author of *Magic at Work: A Guide to Releasing Your Highest Creative Potential* and Dean of the Center for Women and Work and the Center for Analytical Psychology at Mount Vernon College; Charles Suhor, author of *Teaching Values in the Literature Classroom* and Deputy Executive Director of NCTE.

The program will include small group discussions and participatory sessions involving meditation, guided imagery, body wisdom, the role of emotions in teaching and learning, and other topics. Total cost of the conference is \$329 (multiple occupancy), \$399 (double occupancy), or \$549 (single occupancy), which includes registration, lodging in a magnificent Rocky Mountain environment, and all meals. Michael Bernbaum, Director of the United States Holocaust Research Institute of the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum and the Hymen Goldman Adjunct Professor of Theology at Georgetown University in Washington, DC. His books include *A Mosaic of Victims: Non-Jews Persecuted and Murdered by the Nazis* (NY UP, 1990) and *Witness to the Holocaust* (Harper/Collins).
