70 **Legally Speaking** — *The Copyshop Coursepack, Not Fair Use in the Sixth Circuit* by *Anne Klinefelter.* "Multiple copies for classroom use" is listed in section 107 of the Copyright Code as a example of fair use reproduction of copyrighted works, but the Sixth Circuit in November of 1996 held that a commercial copy service's copying and selling of coursepacks without copyright owners' permission was not fair use. The decision, *Princeton University Press v. Michigan Document Services, 99 F.3d 1381 (6th Cir., 1996)* is in line with a 1991 New York federal district.
