Founded in 1943, the University Press of Kentucky publishes about books per year and one journal entitled: *Southern Folklore*. Their backlist includes over 600 titles in print.

University of Kentucky Press Best Kept Secret

Passing for Black: The Life and Careers of Mae Street Kidd, by Wade Hall (1997), \$24.95 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-1669-0. This oral history tells the remarkable life of Mae Street Kidd, born in 1904 in rural Kentucky to a black father and white mother. Throughout her life Kidd negotiated the color line, finding pride in herself and her achievements. She became a successful businesswoman, served in Europe in the Red Cross, and in her 60s began a political

career in the state legislature that lasted for 17 years.

University of Kentucky Press Film Studies Bestsellers

Movies About the Movies: Hollywood Reflected, by Christopher Ames (1997), \$27.95 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-2018-7. An engaging study of how the film industry characterizes itself in Hollywood-on-Hollywood films.

City of Dreams: The Making and Remaking of Universal Pictures, by Bernard F. Dick (1997), \$29.95 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-2016-0. A complete history of Universal, the oldest major film studio still in the business of making movies.

Studio Affairs: My Life as a Film Director, by Vincent Sherman (1996), \$24.95 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-1975-8. A memoir by a veteran studio director who worked with such greats as Bette Davis, Rita Hayworth, Joan Crawford, Errol Flynn, and Clark Gable.


Ida Lupino: A Biography, by William Donati (1996), \$24.95 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-1895-6. The only biography of Lupino, one of the first actresses to also direct film and

television.

Pickford: The Woman Who Made Hollywood, by Eileen Whitfield (1997), \$25.00 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-2045-4. A new biography of one of the most popular film stars of all time, who was also one of the most powerful women ever to work in Hollywood.

Marie Dressler: The Unlikeliest Star, by Betty Lee (1997), \$25.00 cloth, ISBN 0-8131-2036-5. The first biography of Dressler, who earned her fame on Broadway as a comedienne at the turn of the century and took on a second career at the age of 60, becoming one of the most popular movie stars of the early 1930s.

Yesterday's People: Life in Contemporary Appalachia, by Jack E. Weller (1965), \$11.95 paper, ISBN 0-8131-0109-3. A portrait of the Appalachian people, their traditions, and folkways. Over 99,000 copies sold.

River of Earth, by James Still (1978), \$15.95 paper, ISBN 0-8131-1372-5. A beautiful and compelling novel about life in the coal camps of eastern Kentucky by one of the nation's finest writers about Appalachia. Over 30,000 sold in reissued paperback edition.
