Preconferences — November 1, 1995, 1PM-5PM

- 1) **Collection Development Policy Statement Workshop** Presenter: **Tony Ferguson** (Columbia University)
 Ferguson will provide information on how to develop a cost-effective collection development policy statement, e.g., how not to load up the costs of producing such a statement to the point that you can never get sufficient value out of the enterprise to want to keep it up to date. He will begin with a review of suggested ALA standards and then introduce how a simple questionnaire can be used to develop an acceptable narrative and then how the Conspectus or approval plan profiles can be used for the more intensive subject level analysis that is needed. The emphasis will be on the practical aspects of this collection development tool.
- 2) **Copyright and Intellectual Property** Presenter: **Todd Parkhurst** (Schiff, Hardin & Waite)
 As the electronic world encroaches more and more, what will be the meaning of copyright and what is intellectual property? This expert lawyer in the area of intellectual property will share some of the law with us.
- 3) **Using the Internet's Resources** Presenters: **Alis Whitt** (College of Charleston) & **David Magier** (Columbia University)
 This workshop will acquaint us with many of the resources on the World Wide Web that can be used for acquisitions and collection development.
- 4) **Away From the Fringe: African American Publishing and Multicultural Resources** Coordinator: **Glenda Alvin** (Trenton State University)
 This session will offer a broad-based discussion of the current trends among academic and trade presses concerning publishing materials by and about ethnic groups. It will also provide a forum for African American publishers of books and periodicals, as well as demonstrate the availability of multicultural resources on CD-ROM and the Internet, which access information about African Americans, Latinos, Native Americans, Asian Americans, and so called "hyphenated Americans." The panel will reflect upon how interest in diversity and multiculturalism have energized contemporary developments in print and electronic publishing, leading minority topics away from the fringe and into the mainstream.
- 5) **Prioritizing Serials** Coordinator: **Buzzy Basch** (Basch Associates)
 What are ownership alternatives? Hear how colleagues at peer institutions are applying a variety of techniques — collection refinement, electronic access, document delivery, and interlibrary loan — to the challenges of balancing serials resources. First-hand tales from the trenches. Share your experiences, and learn from others.
